



Health Requirements **for** **Outside Breeding Services**

The following are required for any alpaca coming to French Hollow for breeding:

Vermont Requirements: Brucellosis and Tuberculosis tests and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

French Hollow Requirements:

- Client must provide French Hollow Alpacas with ARI certificates for females being bred at the time the breeding contract is executed. We do not practice line breeding and as such, any animal closely related genetically to one of our herd sires will not be approved for breeding to that herd sire.
- Breeding animals must show proof that they are current on Rabies and CDT vaccines.
- Current BVD Test–PCR and Serum Neutralization
- Fecal exam: screening for parasites, Crypto and Ghiardia and Clostridial Toxins performed by a Veterinary Hospital laboratory or an established animal laboratory.
- Complete reproductive exams certified by a licensed veterinarian.
- **Blood work:**
 - **For Mobile Breedings:** PCV and Total Protein. If PCV is less than 25, the alpaca must be screened for EPI and full blood work is required to determine if there is an underlying cause for the anemia.
 - **For Traditional Breedings:** CBC, Chemistry Panel. If PCV is less than 25, the alpaca must be screened for EPI. Additionally, any cria at side (over 2 months of age) must undergo the same diagnostic testing requirements as the dam. The owner must also provide results of the cria's IgG test. (Crias with an IgG lower than 1000 will not be accepted at French Hollow Alpacas for boarding).

NOTE: Alpacas with health problems or reproductive problems will not be accepted at French Hollow Alpacas for breeding.
